Leadership Experience


- ✓ As a class rep I have lead the race out of the classroom after 6pm lectures



- Being a good communicator if there are any suggestions, ideas or issues I will voice them.


My vision is that no one looks back at their pharmacy degrees and only thinks of being holed up in Philson Library. I want you all





(just please don't call me daddy).


I'll be around to listen to your complaints non-stop (or if you just want to talk), try give you some advice and if need be, address issues on your behalf.


Education might be boring, but your education rep doesn't have to be.


