One year ago we were learning to see and realising that the person we swore we've never seen before was actually in our year - now our pharmatrees are blossoming and we (mostly) know each other's names!


It's really cool seeing the cohort help each other out, especially recently in online group chats etc. MAJOR shout out to the people saving us and answering everyone's Medicine Information Queries




























