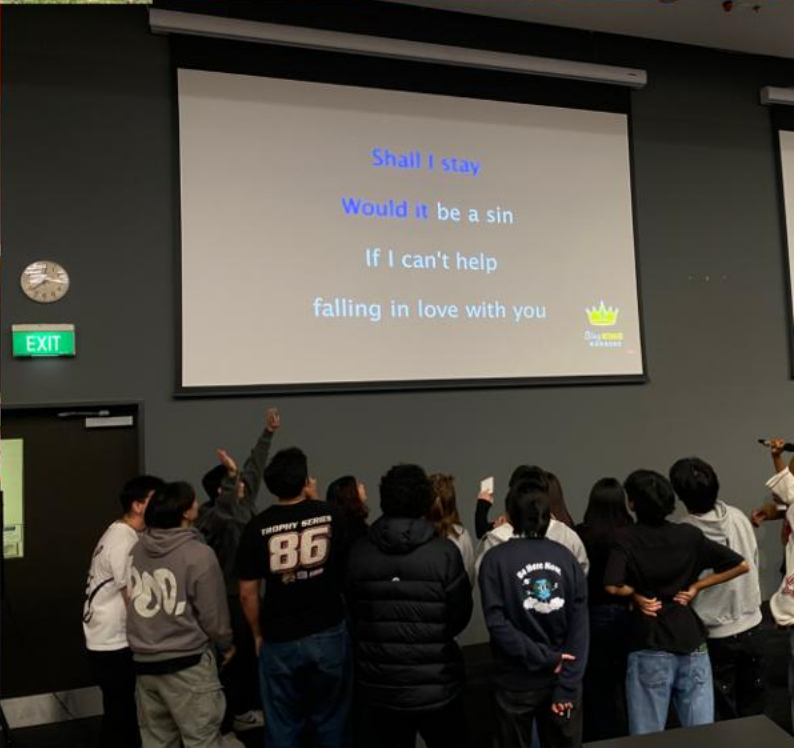
We're excited to see what the incoming APSA Exec Team of 2026 has in store for everyone. We wish you all the best!

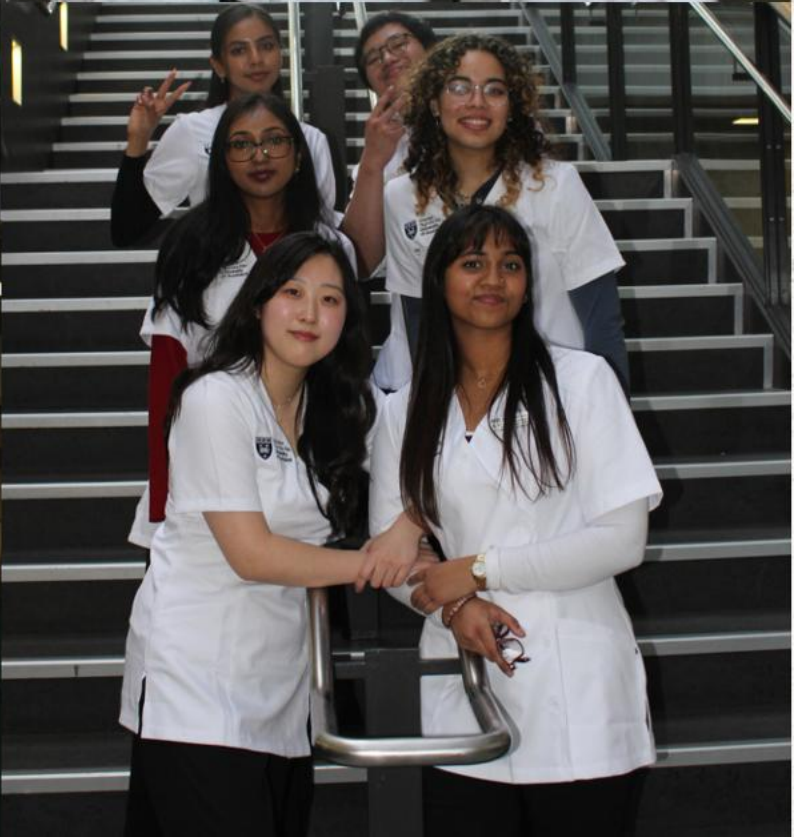

CHRIS AND PIPPI

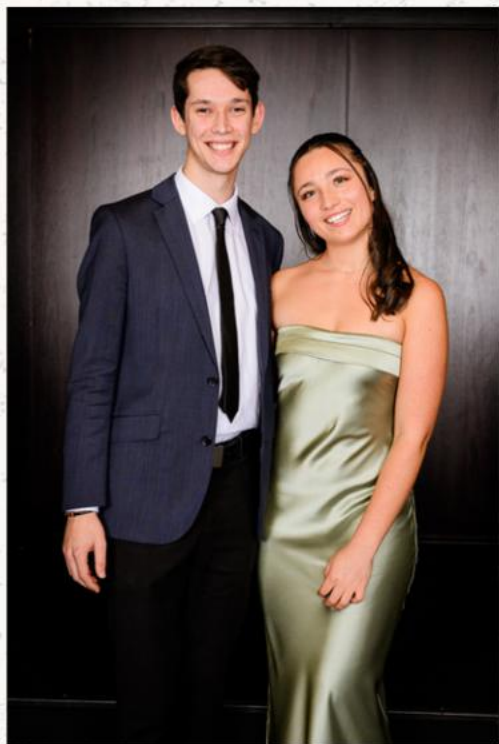
Wow, has semester 2 been full on!

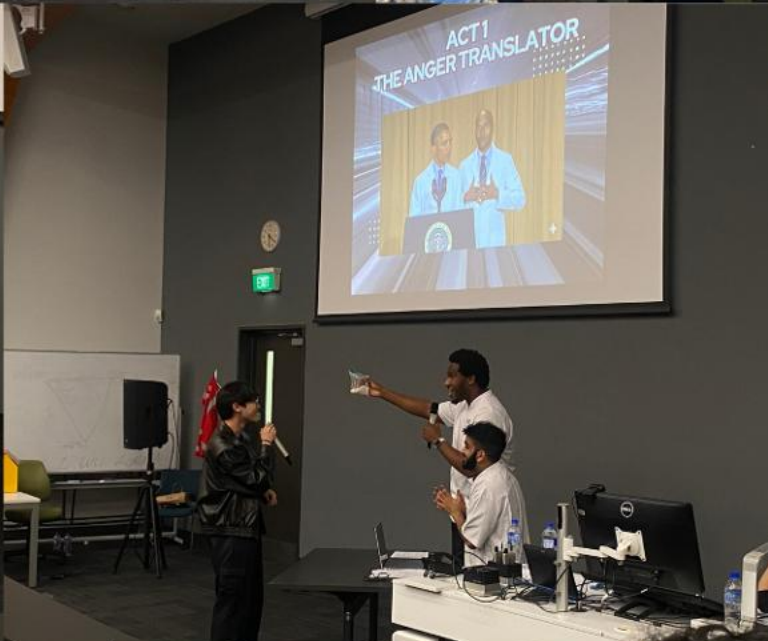
A big shout-out also goes to L'Oréal for their informative session and generous support with our spot prizes. We truly appreciate your partnership.

As our IPSF 2024-2025 mandate with APSA has come to an end, we want to let all Pharmacy students know what we've accomplished throughout Semester 2!!

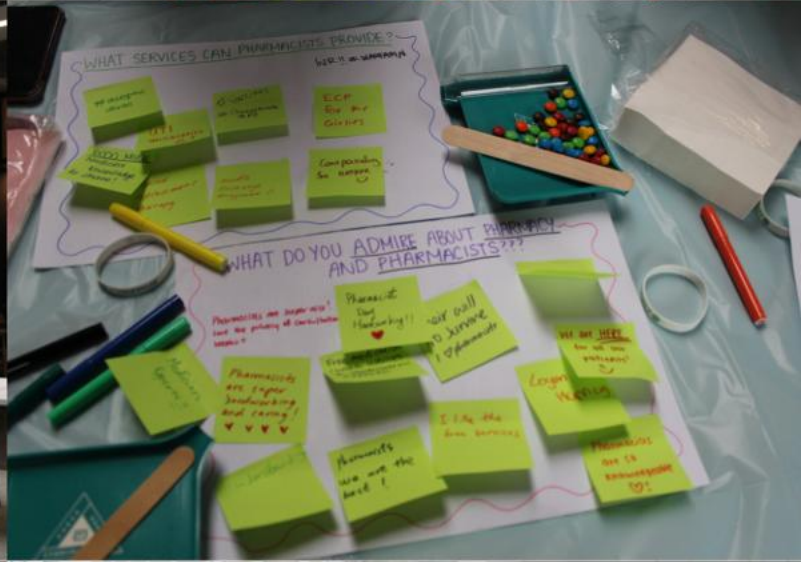

Our Biggest Year Yet!



This year, we proudly supported **65 interns across New Zealand**. With this significant growth, our intern training programme (ITP) continues to evolve. We expanded our training, support, and development opportunities to ensure every intern and preceptor have what they need to thrive.

Some key improvements this year include:

- Increased OSCEs – giving every intern the opportunity to complete at least four original OSCEs (and observing many more) each month.
- Increased Calculation Tests – contributing to a 96% pass rate for our Intern's Calculations Assessment.

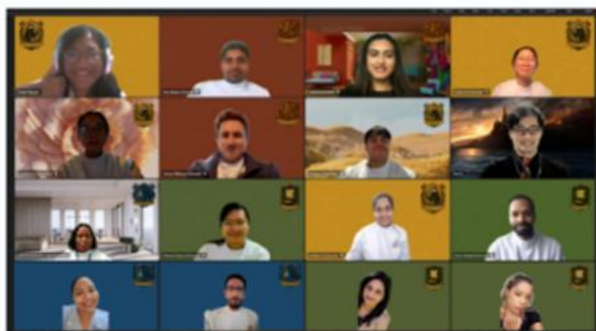
